



Recreational Cannabis Rules by Canadian Jurisdiction

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The chart below highlights current and proposed cannabis regulations. In most, if not all, Canadian jurisdictions, the “rules” described below will undergo changes/additions before coming into force. Also, while the federal statute expressly authorizes provincial/territorial rule-making in connection with cannabis distribution, provincial/territorial legislation will also cover additional areas. For now, where there are conflicts between the federal rules and a particular province/territory’s rules, readers should assume the more restrictive of the two will be applied.
